- (viii) What kind of change in the life of poet is
conveyed in the poem "The Habit of
Perfection"?

- (ix) Mention the name of the character who says, "You give me no peace. Why do you not leave me alone?" (Return of the Native)
- (x) Who reveals the secret of Jack's birth and parentage?

- 6 (a) Explain with reference to context adding critical notes :

– No married man is ever attractive except to his wife.
- (ii) Few girls of the present day have any really solid qualities, any of the qualities that last, and surfaces... There are distinct social possibilities in your profile. The two weak points in our age are its want of principle and its want of profile.
